



MU MATTERS

Mothers' Union Matters.... here at St John's, around the corner and across the world!

We postponed the Wave of Prayer Service from January until Tuesday 4 Feb this year due to the freezing weather in early January. One of the Wave of Prayers focused on women in Nigeria and included information that 40% of the population are under the age of 14. The MU there focuses on supporting education in parenting, health and improving the roles of women and girls. We prayed for Lesotho in southern Africa where there is a large number of child-headed households because both parents have died from HIV infection. Gender Based Violence continues unchecked. In Lesotho there is extreme heat and very strong winds causing disaster to their crops. Then when it does rain, floods occur which washes away crops and soil resulting in extreme hunger. Our prayers do not go unanswered if we can listen to what God says we can do to alleviate those situations.

Our Wave of Prayer was followed by a lively and active AGM for our Branch. We thank God for our continuing programme of activities and the will to undertake a great variety of interaction and fellowship with others.

On Sunday 16 February Revd. Michelle led a moving Service dedicated to the MU within the Morning Worship Service and she blessed our new Branch Committee and the MU programme for the year ahead. We enrolled Gillian Clough as a new Member. Welcome Gillian. Ann Johnson, Margaret France and Jennifer Guy presented a moving sketch on domestic abuse and its impact on family relationships and highlighted some strategies for those who are oppressed as to how to



draw themselves out of being controlled and towards the Agencies which they can turn to for help.

Thank you, Alan, for leading a prayer for Revd. Michelle, myself and Jennifer Guy as we look forward to taking up a three-year appointment at Diocesan level. This is both a privilege and a great responsibility. We all pray that we will respond to this honour and fulfil the duties with zest, with wisdom and in prayer and with humility.





On Friday 28 February, although this is not an exclusive MU event, Pam Dimbleby is leading a short reflection in the Conference Suite on Psalm 139 at 2.00 pm. This will be a prelude to the World Day of Prayer Service which is being held in the Salvation Army Citadel at 2.00 on Friday 7 March,

where the MU has played a significant part in its organisation.

On Thursday 6 March the MU will once again be at Railway Bridge View to lead a craft session under the guidance of Gillian Clough. It will be well within everyone's capabilities and we will have fun following Gillian's directions and helping out the residents and ourselves. Come and join in.... we start with a short reflection and a hymn...often with singing All Things Bright and Beautiful as the residents' request!

Coming onto the horizon is the MU Commissioning Service to be held in Wakefield Cathedral on Saturday 15 March at 1.30 pm. This will be a wonderful and stirring Service seeing myself commissioned as Diocesan President, Michelle as Huddersfield Episcopal Area Chaplain and Jennifer Guy as a General Trustee for the Leeds Diocese. *(See photo above)*. Please do come to this joyful and inspiring service ... we can arrange lift shares.

Yes, keep your diaries open....on Tuesday 18 March Oriel Kelly is coming to our Branch Meeting which will be held in the Church at 2.00 pm. She is coming to talk about Mara and in particular the Safe House. I know that she has been gathering more up to date information about The House and it will be a very interesting opportunity to spend time together.



Practise being tender-hearted

"Be kind to one another, tender-hearted" <u>Ephesians 4:32 NKJV</u>

In his best-selling book 7 Habits of Highly Effective People, author Stephen Covey describes an experience he had on a subway in New York. A man and his children boarded the train, and the children were so loud and rambunctious, they disrupted the entire car. The man sat down beside Covey, seemingly oblivious to the situation. Covey finally said, 'Sir, your children are really disturbing a lot of people. I wonder if you couldn't control them a little more?' The man looked startled. Then he said, 'Oh, you're right. I guess I should do something about it. We just came from the hospital where their mother died about an hour ago. I don't know what to think, and I guess they don't know how to handle it either.' Covey's attitude instantly changed.

Looking back on it later, he admitted that he learned a valuable lesson: seek to understand before seeking to be understood. Sometimes the people who irritate and hurt us do so because they themselves are in pain. They're dealing with issues we don't know about. And when they lash out, it's just the burst dam of personal frustration. And it calls for looking beyond their words and actions and trying to see their hearts. And that's hard to do when you're self-absorbed.

The Bible addresses this: 'Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamour, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. And be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you' (vv. 31-32 NKJV). If you have been grumpy towards those you live with and work with, the word for today is – practise being tender-hearted.

MISSIONS AND CHARITIES

At our recent meeting, we finalised the donation to Mary's Meals. There was £138 in the jars and we decided to make this up to £250 from our allocation.



A representative from the Foodbank gave a presentation in church on February 9th and received a donation of £100 from Missions and Charities and a contribution from the Knit and Natter group.



Representatives from the charities Headway (Huddersfield) and Experience Community based in Slaithwaite will give a presentation in church on March 9th. £250 has already been sent to Headway in Huddersfield, a charity which offers extensive help for people to improve their lives after brain surgery. £250 will be presented to Experience Community.

This is a not-for-profit charity that helps disabled people and those with mobility needs to access the Great Outdoors.

£100 will be sent to UCB for copies of "Word for Today", which will be available in church.

In an update from Mara, we learnt that Nyakiswa is to have a new vicar. The two girls that we are supporting on a secretarial course have just started their second year and money has been sent to cover their course fees and accommodation costs for this term from an existing pot of funds.



We have decided to support "Operation Mobilisation", specifically for Cambodia and initially for £100.

Eco Church News by John

The CAN Bill petition and Calderdale



As I reported last month, the second reading of the CAN (Climate and Nature) Bill has, rather disappointingly, been kicked down the road. But I received a very positive reply from our MP, Joshua Fenton-Glynn. He says he wasn't able to go to the intended reading of the bill on 24th January because of personal circumstances (I understand a bereavement). But here's a paragraph from his letter:

"I am proud of the record we have locally on tackling climate change. Calder Valley truly is a pioneer in the fight against the climate and nature emergency, with work done here recognised as leading the way - such as our natural flood management projects, the creation of wetlands at Brearley, innovative retrofit schemes, and the Climate Action Fund supporting work done by voluntary groups, to name just a few - and I will continue support the fantastic work being done locally in any way I can."

I recently attended our Huddersfield Area PEO (Parish Environment Officer) meeting. Helen Pedley, from Christ Church Sowerby Bridge, told me that Josh F-G was involved in a public debate about a controversial plan to install a waste incinerator on the outskirts of their town. He was supporting local residents who have grave misgivings about the fitness of the applicants to operate the site. Helen sees Josh as a kindred spirit and looks forward to working with him in the days ahead.

Another local Eco champion from Holywell Green, Cordelia Paterson, has joined the Calder Valley Energy Partnership. She showed us, on-screen, the council-run venture to achieve Net Zero, known as the Calderdale Local Area Energy Plan. It's remarkably detailed; for example, addressing the issues of poor insulation and of the potential to fit heat pumps throughout the borough. I haven't studied the economics but the plan is certainly visionary! *To be continued...*

A Celebration of Simon & Garfunkel

On Saturday 8th. February I was fortunate enough to be at church for the 'Celebration of Simon & Garfunkel', performed by duo Tim Chu and Ian Bailey - the UK's Number 1 non tribute band, and I had the most wonderful evening!

Called a 'non tribute band' because of their own special input, they 'wowed us' with their instrumental sections and original material, but once the well-known guitar introductions and the singing began, you could believe it was the original duo. We were immediately taken back to those Simon & Garfunkel days of our youth!

Tim and Ian sang so many of my favourites! When they sang, 'Bridge over Troubled Water' I was a teenager again, sitting on the floor with



the church youth group (probably in my kaftan, flares and headband!) where we used this as a prayer one evening, listening to it over and over...

...and when I got home from the concert on Saturday I immediately went to find my old notebook from my college days (early 70s), full of lyrics and

guitar chord symbols, as we used to do then! (Before you ask, it was a long time ago and I no longer play guitar - probably forgotten which end to blow!) There are no less than thirteen Paul Simon songs and chords handwritten in that notebook!

The thing which struck me most about Tim and Ian though, was their musicality! Evey nuance, every dynamic (volume), every breath taken, every slight change of tempo, all the phrasing, was all sung as if the two of them were one voice, even though they were singing in harmony! I could understand why the advert quoted, "Tim and Ian moved between harmonies and shared vocals like a gestalt entity."

That is <u>so</u> difficult to do, and must have taken many hours of practice, but the two of them were amazing!

Everyone I spoke to said what a brilliant concert it had been, and those of us of a certain age all said how it took us straight back!

SO glad I didn't miss this!


