This month Canon Michael Storey tells us about a favourite Easter hymn, which is also a prayer.

### EASTER DAY

Easter Day is the most important day in the year for Christians. It is the day which gives us "Hope" - something always important, and especially in these days of world turmoil.

As a boy, my memory of Easter Day is being in church, sitting silently and waiting for the cross, candles and choir to go to the choir stalls and the vicar to announce the processional Hymn: No 135 - Ancient and Modern;

> Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. The strife is oer, the battle done, Now is the Victor's triumph won; O let the song of praise be sung, Alleluia

As Christians, we try to live a life, copying the life of Jesus.

This is based on faith, hope and love - the faith and love we give, gives us HOPE, a Hope of Everlasting Life. I always think that that hymn expresses Christian Hope. Alleluia.

## The Easter story: What's Easter all about?

The Easter story lies at the heart of Christianity, celebrating Jesus' resurrection from the dead, three days after being crucified.

### What's Holy Week?

Holy Week is the week between Palm Sunday and Easter eve, a solemn time, when Christians recall the events of Jesus' final days on earth.

### What's Good Friday?

Good Friday is one of the most important dates in the Christian calendar, commemorating the day Jesus was crucified. Good Friday is "good" because as terrible as that day was, it had to happen for us to receive the joy of Easter.



## What's Easter Sunday?

Easter Sunday is the joyous culmination of

Holy Week, and the most important day in the Christian calendar. It celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ, promising new hope, new joy, and new life.
